Minutes of Previous Branch meeting

Secretary's report:

Martin Goodman presented the Secretary's report and advised Members that the Branch AGM would be held on Thursday 25th April at 19.30 hours. Regional Meetings

The Lincolnshire region is looking to organise a "no time to loose" presentation. The Derbyshire region is currently trying to organise a visit to JCB in June. Further information will be circulated once these events are confirmed.

Treasurer's Report:

Martin Goodman advised the current balance in the bank was £3,678. Once the payments for the February away day and the March branch meeting were paid for it is projected the Branch would have a closing balance of around £1,000.

Communications Report:

Andrew Needham reported that the Committee Mailer was working well.

Talk:

Hayley Saunders and Hannah Frost from Shoosmiths gave a legal update. This included details on prosecution statistics for 2017/18. Enforcement notices were up this year to 11,522, 493 cases went to court and the conviction rate was 95%. Fines totaled £72.6 million with 45 being over £500,000, average fine being £147,000 and the largest being £3 million. Suspended sentences were issued in 9% of cases and 7% of cases there was an immediate custodial sentence. With gross negligence manslaughter new guidelines propose jail terms of up to 18 years with a starting point of 8 years. A number of high profile cases with large fines were discussed.
